Autumn Term 2025 curriculum information for parents.

Classes: 4K and 4S

Mathematics

- Place value of numbers with four digits
- Comparing and ordering numbers
- Finding 1000 more or less than a given number
- Reasoning with 4 digit numbers
- Roman Numerals
- Addition and subtraction mentally using column method
- Multiplication and division using formal written methods

Home learning

Home learning will be given on a Friday and should be returned to school on the following Friday.

Home learning will consist of spellings, times tables (tested weekly) Maths, English and talk homework. Additional homework and research may be provided to support learning across the curriculum.

Reading Record

Your child also needs to read for 20 minutes daily. Reading records should be brought in daily and a short comment completed by your child. Parents should assist with reading. See reading record for additional support.

English

In Autumn 1 we will be studying 'The Boy At The Back Of The Class' by Onjali Q. Raúf.

We will be exploring:

- Setting descriptions
- Letters
- Narrative

In Autumn 2 we will be studying various Greek Myths.

We will be exploring:

- Instructions
- Narrative writing
- Structured poetry writing

Science

In Autumn 1, the science topic will be 'Eating and Digestion'. We will be learning about the digestive system and the role of each tooth.

In Autumn 2, the science topic will be 'States of Matter'. Children will explore solids, liquids and gases. Pupils will conduct experiments to expand their scientific understanding and to develop their investigation skills.

Religious Education This term, the children will explore the topic called 'In the Beginning', this will teach the children the importance of the creation story. They will also take part in the topic called 'Advent to Christmas' this will teach the children about traditions and symbols representing Christmas.

Other Faith Unit - Hinduism

Catholic Social Teaching

Children to develop an understanding of the Catholic Social Teachings. Pupils will look at Caritas in Action to help guide their moral compass on how to live out our faith in the world.

RSHE: Pupils will explore the individual. Children will develop an understanding of the importance of valuing themselves as the basis for personal relationships. Children will learn to celebrate similarities and differences, and to appreciate and look after their bodies as gifts from God. Children will also learn about the physical and emotional changes during puberty.

Computing: This term the topics will be Online Safety and Coding. Children will be using the Chromebooks to explore programming on Purple Mash and how to stay safe online.

History: Pupils will be studying 'Anglo Saxons', exploring who they were and where they came from. Pupils will study archaeological evidence and ask and answer questions based on their learning.

Geography: We will be studying 'Europe' exploring Europe by identifying the countries, rivers and seas. Pupils will also develop their map reading skills.

DT: In Autumn 1, the children will be designing and creating their own pencil cases.

Art: In Autumn 2, the children will be learning about Seurat and the art technique of Pointillism.

P.E: Pupils will be learning the different skills in gymnastics and dance. They will also develop their skills in football and basketball.

Music: Children will learn about drumming traditions with a special focus on African percussion instruments such as Djembe, Djun Djun, Congas, Bongos, Shekere and claves.

French: By the end of this unit pupils will have the knowledge and skills to present both orally and in written form about the pets they have and/or do not have in French. They will move from 1st person singular to 3rd person singular verb usage so they are able to say what the pet is called and use conjunctions more confidently. By the end of this unit pupils will have the knowledge and skills necessary to perform a short role-play in a French tea room.

You can help your child by...
