Summer Term 2026 curriculum information for parents.

Classes: 6H, 6L and 6S Teachers: Ms Hylton, Mr Lynch and Mrs Sugrue

This term we will be learning about:

Mathematics

- Revision of how to convert between fractions, decimals and percentages
- Analysing Statistical information
- Investigating Mathematical puzzles
- Problem solving
- Algebra
- Estimating
- Revision of long multiplication and long division.
- Development of arithmetic calculations

English

- Comprehension of a variety of genres including: narrative extracts, information texts and poetry.
- Development of writing skills that showcase pupils' learning of a range of spelling, punctuation and grammar concepts.
- Formal letter, Diary Entry, Information text and Narrative writing and their key features.
- Poetry and their key features.
- Historical Stories and their key features.
- Refining, editing and redrafting.
- Critiquing their own and other's work.

Religious Education

During the topic, 'To the ends of the Earth', pupils will hear stories such as, the empty tomb and the appearance to Mary Magdala, Appearances to the disciples, Christians believe in the Resurrection and the story of Stephen. During the topic, 'Dialogue and Encounter', pupils will make simple connections between some Dharmic beliefs, practices and way of life.

Computing: Text Adventures/Quizzing

Pupils will create their own text-based adventure, using maps and coding. Pupils will then explore the different types of questions they can ask and the different types of quizzes they can construct for a specific purpose and audience.

History & Geography: Our Local Area

Pupils will develop an understanding of the history of Wembley. Pupils will explore the area surrounding the school by looking at land uses, population, functions and services available.

RSHE

In the topic 'Created to Live in Community' pupils will explore the individual's relationship with the wider world. We will look at how human beings are relational by nature and are called to love others in the wider community through service and through dialogue. Teaching includes the common good, the human person, social relationships and stewardship.

P.E: Football, Handball and Tennis

Year 6 will practice different invasion games, such as Gaelic football and handball. Finally, they will also take part in tennis.

Music: Musicianship Skills/Samba Band

Pupils will continue to expand their knowledge of steel pans and samba skills and develop their vocal skills in more self-selected music and ensembles.

French

Pupils will learn about other countries around the globe that speak French. They will also learn about the currencies, flags, cultural celebrations and traditions of those countries.

Art and Design: Cityscapes

Pupils will learn about Cityscapes by exploring the artwork of artists to develop their artistic skills.

Design Technology: Great British Dishes

Pupils will explore different Great British national and traditional dishes to create their own.

Science: Great British Scientists/Body Health

- Research and describe the work of some British scientists and how their work has influenced scientific understanding around the world.
- Investigate the effects of diet, exercise and substances on the body and factors that affect the muscle groups, including the heart.

Home Learning:

Your child has received all of their home learning for the next coming weeks. This should be brought to school daily to aid revision. CGP Books are to be completed every night.

Alongside this your child should read for at least 20 minutes and develop their mental arithmetic skills and rapid recall of their times tables. Pupils will make effective use of the school's website and other sites;

You can help your child by ...

Ensuring your child completes their home learning to a high standard, each piece of work must have a parental signature and ensure that your child hands it in on time.

Help develop your child's problem-solving skills by asking them questions related to real life situations, e.g. time, cost of shopping etc.

Encourage your child to read independently for thirty minutes each evening.

Help your child to research effectively using a variety of sources, e.g. books, internet, pictures or plans etc ensuring e-safety.

Ensuring your child brings in the following with them to school: Soft pencil case, 2 HB pencils, rubber, sharpener, green biro pen, small ruler, highlighter pen, dry wipe marker, colouring pencils and glue stick.

Providing a school water bottle labelled with the child's name and a piece of fruit for your child's break each day.
